VOCABULARY IN CONTEXT!



**A powerful technique for effortlessly
learning grammar structures.**

What is grammar?

Grammar is a set of rules that explains how to use a language and has many complicated concepts like:

Prepositions, tenses, conditionals, third person, subjunctive, passive form, and rules which try to tell us how to use the language.

The problem is that grammar rules are usually **too complicated and very confusing**, and this doesn't help when you try to speak.

The result of this is **frustrated students** who after years of effort **can't speak English fluently**.

So, my favorite rule is:

DON'T STUDY GRAMMAR RULES.

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**Don't base your English learning
on mastering grammar.**

It's a huge mistake!

You'll waste money, energy and time.

You speak your own language effortlessly,
without making mistakes and without thinking
about grammar. You do it automatically.

That's the goal you should have:

Automatize your speaking.

Does it mean that grammar
is completely useless?

Not exactly. Grammar can be useful in
order to **improve your writing skills,**
and to check minor aspects.

**If you wish to improve your
speaking skills, grammar is
not the answer.**

Now, I'd like to show you a powerful technique to deeply learn grammar structures.

I call it **Point of View** mini-story.

How does it work?

You read and listen to the same story
from different grammar points of view.

For example, I tell the same story in the
past and then in the future.

This way you can naturally notice how
the past and future tenses change.

This idea can be applied for singular and plural,
the first and third person, and other combinations.

**In my premium English courses,
I use the Point of view technique.**

**Let me show you an example from one of the
lessons. This is just small part of the lesson:**

POINT OF VIEW

(improve your grammar)

Welcome to the Point of View lesson of the unit Waves. I will tell you the story twice. In the past and in the future tense.

Now, in the past tense.

Five years ago, you were living in the New York zoo. Your lives weren't bad. You had free food, and you didn't have to work for it. You were famous, and you usually wore sunglasses.

However, you weren't happy. You thought the zoo was boring.

You also wanted to surf, but you couldn't do it in the zoo. You wanted a change in your lives.

One day you decided to write a list of goals. You wrote that you wanted to have an adventure. You also wrote that you wanted to surf.

After writing the list, you decided to escape from the zoo. You chose a new place to go. You wanted to go to Hawaii. You thought it would be a good idea.

At first, you tried to swim towards Hawaii, but you got tired. Hawaii is very far away from the New York Zoo! Then you decided to go to Hawaii inside a box, by mail. What brave penguins!

You arrived in Hawaii, and you enjoyed the beaches. There you weren't famous, but you liked much more this new place.

All right! Now in the future tense!

In five years, you'll live in the New York zoo. Your lives won't be bad. You'll have free food, and you won't have to work for it. You'll be famous, and you'll usually wear sunglasses.

However, you won't be happy. You'll think the zoo is boring. You'll also want to surf, but you won't be able to do it in the zoo. You'll want a change in your lives.

One day you'll decide to write a list of goals. You'll write that you'll want to have an adventure. You'll also write that you'll want to surf.

After writing the list, you'll decide to escape from the zoo. You'll choose a new place to go. You'll want to go to Hawaii. You'll think it will be a good idea.

**It seems simple, but it's a
very powerful technique!**
